



Accessing Free Wifi at ASU



Directions to ASU Rural Road Parking Structure

Visitors must enter by traveling west on Terrace Road from Rural Road.

As you might expect, with nearly 60,000 students, parking at the Tempe Campus is challenging at best. If you are staying at the Four Points Sheraton in Tempe and are able to withstand a 15-20 minute walk in the Arizona heat, we recommend leaving your rental car at the hotel and walking to both venue sites (ISTB4 on Sunday and Old Main on Monday-Friday).

Not everyone is staying within walking distance; for those individuals who would like to drive your rental cars to the venue, we recommend using one of the two parking options listed above. Let us know if you need help navigating Tempe or finding an alternative location to park:

Directions to ASU Fulton Center Parking Structure

From Rural Road and University Drive:
 [1] Head west on University Drive
 [2] Turn right (north) on College Avenue
 [3] Take your first right into the structure

From Mill Avenue and University Drive:
 [1] Head east on University Drive
 [2] Turn left (north) on College Avenue
 [3] Take your first right into the structure

*Park in any open space that paying special ATTENTION to all signs and markings

****All tickets must be presented to the Cashier booth located on the south side of the structure (east side during peak hours) to obtain an exit ticket.**

Walking Directions

From Four Points Sheraton to ISTB4 (Tutorial Day, 9/22):

0.5 miles, 11 minutes walking

1. Head north on S Rural Rd toward Apache Blvd. (0.3 miles)
2. Turn left onto E Lemon St. (0.2 miles)
3. Turn right onto S McAllister Ave. (0.1 miles)
4. Destination will be on your right. The entrance to ISTB4 is on the North side of the building. Our event is in the auditorium.

From Four Points Sheraton to Old Main (DNA19, 9/22-9/26 and Nanoday, 9/27):

0.9 miles, 19 minutes walking

1. Head north on S Rural Rd toward Apache Blvd. (0.5 miles)
2. Turn left toward E Tyler St. (410 feet)
3. Continue straight onto E Tyler St. (367 feet)
4. Go straight through the stop sign. (0.3 miles)
5. Walk through the path on campus. Old Main will be on the right. Our event is in the ballroom upstairs.

From Parking Option 1 (Rural Road Structure) to ISTB4 (Tutorial Day, 9/22):

Directly adjacent to ISTB4, 1 minute walking

1. Head due west out of the parking structure.
2. ISTB4 is building directly adjacent from the parking garage. The entrance to ISTB4 is on the North side of the building. Our event is in the auditorium.

From Parking Option 1 (Rural Road Structure) to Old Main (DNA19, 9/22-9/26 and Nanoday, 9/27):

0.5 miles, 9 minutes walking

1. Head due west out of the parking structure. Continue until you reach S McAllister Ave. (300 feet)
2. Turn right onto S McAllister Ave. (0.1 mile)
3. When you reach the stop sign at S McAllister and E Tyler, turn left. (0.3 miles)
4. Continue walking on the path on campus until you reach Old Main on the right. Our event is in the ballroom upstairs.

From Parking Option 2 (Fulton Center Garage) to ISTB4 (Tutorial Day, 9/22): **not recommended**

From Parking Option 2 (Fulton Center Garage) to Old Main (DNA19, 9/22-9/26 and Nanoday, 9/27):

0.2 miles, 4 minutes walking

1. Head south on S College Ave toward E University Dr. (361 feet)
2. Cross the street at the light.
3. Take a left on the path and a right onto S Cady Mall. (30 feet)
4. Continue walking down the path until you reach Old Main directly in front of you. Our event is in the ballroom upstairs.

Desert Botanical Garden



On Thursday afternoon there will be an opportunity to relax and explore the Phoenix Desert Botanical Garden. Guests have the option of going on guided tours of the Garden, or relaxing inside and enjoying a cocktail. The DNA19 banquet dinner will immediately follow the tours/cocktail hour.

A few facts about the garden:

Back in the 1930s, a small group of passionate local citizens saw the need to conserve our beautiful desert environment. One was Swedish botanist Gustaf Starck, who found like-minded residents by posting a sign, "Save the desert," with an arrow pointing to his home. In 1936, they formed the Arizona Cactus and Native Flora Society (ACNFS) to sponsor a botanical garden to encourage an understanding, appreciation and promotion of the uniqueness of the world's deserts, particularly our Sonoran Desert.

Then Gertrude Webster, whose home was located in nearby Arcadia, joined the Society. She offered her encouragement, connections and financial support to establish the botanical garden in Papago Park.

"The Garden's vision is to be the premier center in the world for the display, study and understanding of desert plants and their environments. The Garden strives to be an indispensable resource in the Southwestern United States for helping individuals learn about Sonoran Desert Plants as well as desert plants of the world, so that they will conserve and protect the natural world for the benefit of future generations. Every element of the Garden will reflect excellence, beauty and inspiration to transform the visitor experience into one of discovery and meaning about deserts and desert plants."

Getting to the garden:

The last presentation on Thursday, September 26th will end at 3:00 pm. At that time DNA19 conference attendees will walk as a group to a nearby location where three charter buses will transport you to the Desert Botanical Garden: 1201 N. Galvin Parkway, Phoenix, AZ 85008.

The pickup location is the NE corner of 7th Street and College Ave. Walk down the stairs on the North side of Old Main and down to the path that leads to University Ave. Cross the street at the light and continue walking down College Ave until you reach the NE corner of 7th Street and College Ave. The buses will not leave the pickup site until around 3:20 pm. After the banquet, at approximately 8:30 pm the buses will return conference attendees to the same location.
